Flanders Field American Cemetery, Belgium



At this peaceful 6-acre site in Belgium rest 368 of our military dead, most of whom gave their lives in liberating the soil of Belgium in World War I. Their headstones are aligned in four symmetrical areas around the white stone chapel that stands in the center of the cemetery.
